

SALT OF THE EARTH AND LIGHT OF THE WORLD!

Jesus uses salt and light, two things common and necessary for enhanced life, to describe the essential gifts discipleship brings to the world. Disciples are to be salt and light for others. Jesus calls us to assess whether our discipleship has lost its potency because our salt has become flat and our light has become dim. The good news is that no matter how bland or dim our discipleship, Christ never throws us out, tramples us underfoot, or hides us. Jesus calls disciples to be "the salt of the earth" and the "light of the world." However, Christ must first be our salt and light.
